

#### **Coventry Cathedral**

Eighteen members of Oakham WI travelled by coach to Coventry. Our first stop was St Mary's Guildhall, one of the finest surviving medieval guildhalls in the country; whilst it was damaged in the Blitz which destroyed the nearby cathedral, its kitchen has been in continuous use since 1340.


Mistress Mary gave us a tour, explaining the history and showing us the tapestry which was made for the Guildhall in 1505-15 and has hung in place ever since. After the fascinating tour we enjoyed an excellent lunch in the undercroft, a lovely venue.











After lunch we had some free time to look around the historic cathedral quarter before meeting at the cathedral for our afternoon tour. We started in the old cathedral, the medieval St Michael's which was destroyed during a concentrated German air raid on 14th November 1940 and were told that the King visited the day after the bombing and was moved to tears by the destruction he saw. The ruins were intentionally preserved as a symbol of peace and reconciliation, and the new cathedral was built alongside them.

We then moved into the stunning new cathedral built in 1962, designed by Sir Basil Spence. The interior is notable for its huge tapestry of Christ, designed by Graham Sutherland, and the Baptistry window designed by John Piper (made by Patrick Reyntiens), of abstract design that occupies the full height of the bowed baptistery, which comprises 195 panes, ranging from white to deep colours.







Throughout the cathedral there were many wonderful works of art, many donated from abroad, including a Canadian maple leaf, a sculpture showing the city of Coventry donated by Minnesota and an art work donated by art students from Dresden.

The font made from a boulder from near Bethlehem, has a basin on top in the form of a scallop shell on the top. Ralph Beyer, a German-born sculptor, designed and carved the shell. Beyer's family left Germany in 1932, but his mother, who was Jewish, returned to Germany during World War II, was incarcerated at Auschwitz and died there in 1945.





We all enjoyed an interesting and thought-provoking day.

# Discover a Real Roman Experience: Jewry Wall, Leicester's Exciting New Visitor Attraction - Tuesday 10 February

Leicester's rich Roman heritage is about to come alive like never before as Jewry Wall reopens its doors! Following an extensive refurbishment, the museum will unveil an immersive, state-of-the-art exhibition that takes visitors on a journey through Roman Leicester, offering a unique blend of history, objects, storytelling, and interactive experiences.

Jewry Wall is part of a 2nd Century Bath House and is one of Britain's largest surviving pieces of Roman masonry, standing as a testament to the grandeur of the ancient town of Ratae Corieltauvorum (the Roman name for Leicester).

Now the 60's museum building adjacent to this remarkable site has been transformed into an exciting new attraction that brings history to life in an engaging and accessible way for visitors of all ages. The re imagined Jewry Wall is a groundbreaking experience, placing storytelling at its heart, transporting visitors back almost 2,000 years through a mix of:

- Real Romans Discover stories of the people of Roman Leicester, brought to life through cutting-edge visual story-telling.
- Everyday objects of life from two millennia ago.
- Multimedia immersive displays Will transport you into the past with atmospheric projections and digital reconstructions of Ratae (Roman Leicester).

We are to travel by train from Oakham, departing on the 9.21 train to Leicester. We will then walk to the museum and enjoy coffee before, depending on numbers, either having a guided tour or self guiding around the museum.

At 1pm we will break for lunch in their new cafe which has fabulous views over the Roman bathhouse and has a variety of lunch options.

We will return to Oakham on the 15.12 train, but you may of course choose to stay in Leicester to do a bit of shopping before making your own way back to Oakham on a later train.

There are no minimum numbers for this event to go ahead but if we have a minimum of 15, we may be able to arrange a private tour and will be able to reserve restaurant places. The cost for entry is £11.50 for concessions or £12.50 standard entry.

CAN YOU HELP? Many of you may know that the first publicly accessible part of Oakham Canal starts on Springfield Estate at Griffiths Close/Oakfield with the footpath running north towards the bypass at Burley Park Way. This footpath was constructed in 1997 - but it is not currently an official public right of way as it sits on land still owned by the original housing developer. We are hoping to get the footpath converted into a public right of way in order to get it maintained – you might have noticed parts of the edge of this footpath are slipping down the canal bank.

To do this, we need to apply to Rutland County Council to make a change to the official map of public footpaths, a process called an application to make a Definitive Map Modification Order (DMMO).

This is where you can help. We need around 20 people who have walked this particular footpath on a regular basis for at least the last 10 years and who are happy to complete something called a User Evidence form, which is mostly tick boxes. The form also requires you to give your contact details. We then collect all of the User Evidence forms and submit them along with the DMMO application to Rutland County Council.

We are running a workshop in Oakham on Sunday 23 November 2025 to explain in more detail what is involved. If you think you can help by completing a User Evidence form please let us know below, or email info@oakhamcanal.org and include "DMMO" in the title of your email.
